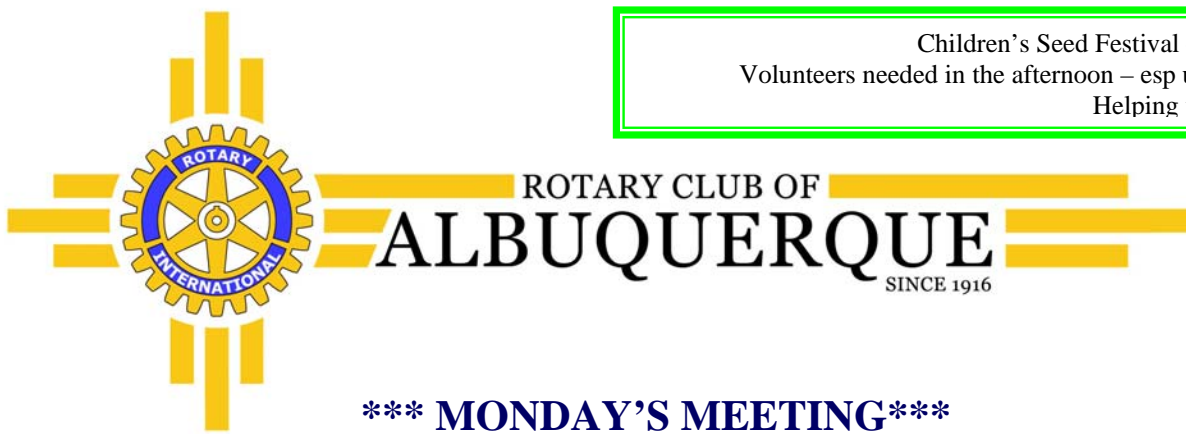

NINOS FLAMENCOS

Eva Encinias-Sandoval
Program & Project Director

After studying flamenco in Spain and Mexico with numerous artists, Ms. Encinias-Sandoval began studying several forms of dance at the University of New Mexico in Albuquerque, including Modern, Jazz, Tap, and African dance. As a choreographer, she has created more than 30 diverse, original works. From 1970 to 1989 she directed her own performing company, Ritmo Flamenco. In 1976, Ms. Encinias-Sandoval joined the UNM Dance Program where she soon developed the only flamenco undergraduate and graduate degree program in the U.S. In 1986, Ms. Encinias-Sandoval founded the annual Festival Flamenco Internacional, the largest and most comprehensive flamenco festival outside Spain, an event recognized for its authenticity and creative significance by Spanish flamenco artists. In line with her dedication to disseminating flamenco to New Mexico communities, Ms. Encinias-Sandoval founded the National Institute of Flamenco (NIF) in 1986. This non-profit organization preserves the art and culture of flamenco through many avenues. In 1999, Ms. Encinias-Sandoval co-founded the Conservatory of Flamenco Arts, the educational branch of NIF. Ms. Encinias-Sandoval has received numerous awards for excellence in the arts as an educator, presenter and performer.

You CAN Talk about Your Business at a Rotary Meeting!

For many years, our Club exacted a fine from any member that mentioned his or her business during a meeting. Part of the logic was that no one should address our meeting, for a non-Rotary purpose, for free. Your Board of Directors has decided to move a little further along that logical path—and at the same time avoid raising the dues or other costs to members—by offering a “Business Minute,” actually 3 minutes during a meeting, at an appropriate rate, for any member that would like to speak to the Club. Here are the guidelines:

- A member may speak, or present a video, for 3 minutes, and may speak from the podium or from the floor. You may be seated at the headtable if you wish.
- A table will be provided near the door for a display, and brochures may be placed on the tables in the dining room.
- Time will be available when other parts of the program permit. Arrangements should be made with Ann at least two weeks in advance.
- The cost will be \$250 per meeting. This amount is payable to the Club as a contribution to operating expenses, and is not a charitable deduction.

Below are a couple of downloads and you can decide for yourself. I'll send you another reminder next week for the April 25th gig. I hope to see you at both events.

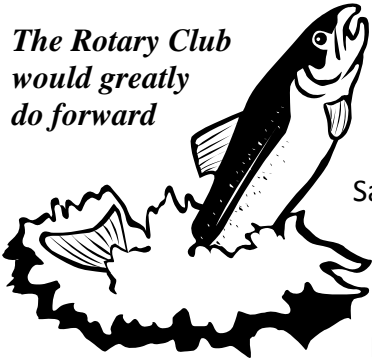
