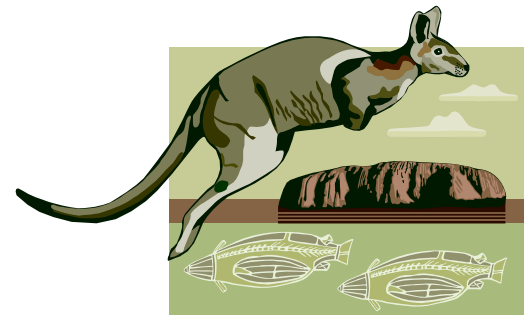

Rotary Seeking Applicants for Professional Exchange to Australia

Rotary Clubs of New Mexico and western Texas seek applications for four positions for young professionals to visit Australia for one month in the spring of 2011 as part of the Group Study Exchange (GSE) program of Rotary International Foundation. Selection is based on application and an interview process, and the group will be led by a Rotarian.

During the trip, set for approximately March 10 to April 13 2011, the group will give presentations that share information about the U.S. and New Mexico/western Texas and experience the customs, vocations and lifestyle of Australia. The goal is to promote international understanding and goodwill through person-to-person contact.

While abroad, team members will stay in Rotarians' homes and will meet professional counterparts, give presentations about our area to Rotary Club members, and experience social/cultural/sightseeing opportunities with their hosting Rotarian families and clubs. All travel, overnight stays and food costs are covered by Rotary International. The only expense to the team member is for passport, medical exam, travel insurance, small gifts for their host families, plus their own personal incidental expenses.

Applicants must live in New Mexico or western Texas, have been in their career for at least three years, be 25 to 40 years of age and be in excellent health. They cannot be Rotary members or an immediate relative of a Rotary member. Each application must be signed by a local Rotary Club and the listing of clubs is on the web site.

The deadline for application postmark is Wednesday, Sept. 16 and interviews will be held on Sept. 24th and 25th in Roswell, NM. For information, go to www.rotary5520.org and click on the GSE link at the top of the page. You may also call Donna Pedace at 505-685-4115 or email at pedaceabq@aol.com

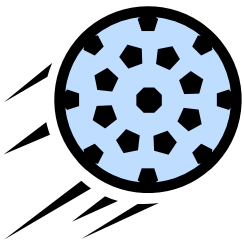
